Prof. J. Philip, a Law graduate from Kerala University joined XLRI, Jamshedpur as a student and later became its Dean. He is a major contributor to the founding of the PGDM programme at XLRI. In 1980 he joined the Oberoi Group of hotels where he was the vice-president, Human resources. Later, he served as the Director of IIM-Bangalore for an entire term of six years.
